It is with pride and enthusiasm, we, the Student Council of Livingston High School, officially submit this letter of intent to seek the office of State Vice President. Our experience and success in District 17 and TASC have helped prepare us for this position. We are excited about the opportunities that come with this position and will strive to continue our tradition of excellence, if elected.

Under the leadership of our advisor, Aaron Kerss, the Livingston High School Student Council served as the TASC State Parliamentarian School for the 2022-2023 school year. We have been actively involved in District 17 events and activities, consistently, for the past nine years. We have served as a District 17 Officer School for seven of the last eight years, serving the past three times as D17 Vice President. We have hosted conferences at the district level, consisting of District 17 Fall Conference in 2020 and District 17 Spring Conferences in 2022 & 2023. Currently we are preparing to host the District 17 2025 Spring Conference in Beaumont, Texas. We have been a TASC Sweepstakes school since 2015 and have also qualified to receive the National Gold Council of Excellence Award for the past eight consecutive years.

While many areas have "returned to normal," the lingering effects of the Covid 19 pandemic still remain present in areas of our state. One of the areas that was hit extremely hard and has been slow to recover has been nursing home facilities. Texas ranks third in the nation for the number of residents living in nursing homes, with more than 86,000 residents statewide. According to the CDC, approximately 1 in 3 residents of nursing homes is diagnosed with depression with a majority of cases stemming from loneliness and a lack of stimulation. By partnering with local nursing homes, we can provide these valuable members of our communities with a sense of purpose and build relationships that transcend generations.
