Roma High School is a Title 1 school and has a majority of students who are low — middle income and cannot afford to pay for leadership/summer workshops. The only funds our district aids student council with is paying for our State Conference Registration fees, which we are very grateful for. Our council has to fundraise to pay for transportation to the State Conference and to District Meetings (which are an hour away from us), for our hotel and food for the state trip, for any leadership and summer workshops the student and advisor have chosen to attend, and for any student council events and activities that we host at our school. I have chosen not to attend advisor workshops as to not spend any money that we can use for the council itself as it would have to come out of our money that we fundraise. This was mine and my students' first year attending a summer workshop as we were able to afford to pay for one student, I worked on staff and District 16 paid for one of my students as she is D16 President currently.

Our student representative, Isabella Elizondo, is very driven and hard-working. She has committed herself to study and learn what student council is on the local, district and state level. She is very passionate about serving the community locally, district wide, and state wide. We understand we (both Isabella and I) have not had the privilege of attending many leadership and summer workshops or other TASC events, but we are committed to continue learning as much as we can and serve the state to our best capacity.
