## Shoes for Kids

**Purpose:** The purpose of this project is to give back to the less fortunate kids in our district by purchasing a brand new pair of shoes and socks for them.

**Description:** Our student council sponsor gets in touch with the elementary school counselor's and gives out sign up sheets for the parents/guardians of kiddos in our district to fill out. Each school gets 10 forms for kids to go on the field trip with us and 10 forms for older students that we just shop for. All together we buy around 100 pairs of shoes and socks district wide. On the form the guardians will choose the top three types of shoes the student is in need of. Out of these forms we make stickers with the students names and shoes needed and sizes. We split into 2 groups and took buses to pick up the students from their school and take them to our local shoe store. On each bus we have around 25 high school volunteers that each elementary kiddo gets to pick to be their buddy for the day. These high school students range from student council members, officers, PALS students, NHS, ROTC, and teen leadership kids. Many of our kids fit into more than one of the organizations noted above. As far as faculty, we take our student council sponsor and one other teacher to chaperone the day of. When the little kids get on the bus they choose who they want to stick with for the day rather than being assigned to a person. This helps both the elementary students feel as special as possible and helps eliminate the possibility of them being picked last. At the shoe store we buy shoes for the students there and also our student council officers buy shoes for the students that could not travel with us that day. After buying shoes we then take the kids to the park for lunch and play for a few hours before taking them back to school. For lunch we get in touch with pizza places locally and ask for donations. When we drop off the kids back at school, all of the volunteers get out first and make a spirit hands tunnel and cheer for our kids as they run through back into school.
