

NAME: Spring High Feed & Serve

PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES: Our school is 72% economically disadvantaged and 60% receive free and reduced lunch. The teachers in our district work hard and often are unable to plan many activities outside the classroom. Feed and serve is our contribution to our school families, community and district. We aim to feed our community with direct access to free food and food drives. We aim to serve our district by supporting our feeder schools.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITIES: **Food Drives:** Spring HS StuCo had one individual food drive on campus this year in August. We supported our Lions Player Theater company and our Athletic Teams in October and November.

Mobile Food Pantry: Partnering with Communities in Schools, CIS, and the Houston Food Bank we were able to bring the Mobile food Pantry to our campus twice a month to feed anyone in our community who needed food. To date we have held 6 food distributions on our campus feeding over 1000 families. We have eight additional food distributions scheduled this school year. Communities Youth Services, CYS, and Spring ISD also joined our campaign. Our campus staff supported us by sharing flyers with their neighbors, their church and their families. The teachers also supported us by allowing our StuCo members to be excused from class as our Market is on Wednesdays from 9am- 12pm.

Service: Our members wanted to do more activities where they could support the schools they previously were enrolled in. We offered our services to every Elementary and Middle school zoned to Spring High School. The response was overwhelming. We helped with trunk or treats, carnivals and chaperoned dances. We partnered with our T.A.F.E., they had 2 internships with transportation. We offered lunch tutorials at the schools they visited weekly. We volunteered over 600 hours.
