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

ABOUT TASC

The Texas Association of Student Councils is a non-profit organization serving elementary, middle school, and high school student councils in Texas. TASC builds leaders who positively impact our schools, our communities, our state, and our nation through leadership development in secondary schools in Texas. We believe in a powerful student voice, the

journey of leadership, and in building a strong web of support for students and advisors. We know that leadership skills can be learned and enhanced, and we work daily to do just that. Organized in 1937, TASC serves about 1,200 member schools by providing opportunities for advisors and student leaders to interact and learn through outstanding programs such as this Annual Conference.

NAME BADGES / WRISTBANDS

Each registered delegate and invited guest will be given an official conference name badge and TASC wristband. To ensure student safety, these items must be worn at all times. The conference wristband is admission to all conference sessions. Those without a TASC wristband and name badge will be required to leave. Additionally, the color of the wristband will determine the rotation to be followed for breakout sessions on Day 2 afternoon.

DRESS CODE

The TASC Board of Directors requests that all attendees follow the TASC Conference dress code. <u>No shorts of any type are to be worn</u> to any conference activity with the exception of the night at Six <u>Flags</u>. Hats or caps are not allowed in the building, and all shirts and dresses must have sleeves. Security will help monitor dress code.

STUDENT DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

Student drop-off is on the Promenade Parkway directly in front of the Irving Convention Center.

PARKING

Parking is available at the Irving Convention Center for a \$12 charge with come-and-go privileges. Parking is also available at the Westin Hotel and Convention Center for a \$12 charge per day. <u>The height limit at both venues is 10 feet which will not accommodate buses.</u> There are very few bus parking spots behind the Irving Convention Center. Special arrangements must be made with TASC to access that parking. TASC will issue a parking pass which must be visible on the dash of each vehicle admitted to that large vehicle parking lot. Parking passes at Six Flags are included with your park admission fee.

GENERAL SESSION ENTRY AND SEATING

Doors to the General Session will open approximately 30 minutes to one hour before session start time. Any school group may enter the room and secure seating, but the room will not have any activity until 15 minutes before the official start time. Schools may reserve seats for their delegation ONLY. <u>At least one person from</u> <u>the delegation must remain with marked seats at all times</u>. Any item used to mark seats reserved will be removed if there is not at least one person from the delegation present at all times. <u>Please fill</u> <u>the seats in the middle of rows first. Do not leave empty seats. Do</u> <u>NOT run in the Convention Center</u>. The fire marshal prohibits standing at the sides or back of the auditorium. Due to security needs, **all advisors must be seated with their students**.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

While you are invited to update your social media about conference activities, we ask that advisors and students silence their phones and follow rules of business etiquette in the use of cell phones and tablet computers. Please be a model of consideration and respect for all attending conference sessions.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR

With the convention attendance totaling almost 4,000 delegates, advisors must sit with their students during the general sessions and monitor and control excessive noise. Even a few whispers in the auditorium create a lot of noise. Always treat speakers on stage with courtesy and respect. <u>Advisors: Please ensure that your students remain seated during performances</u>. Walking from the general assembly area to the halls is distracting.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE

No outside food or drinks may be taken into the Irving Convention Center. Meals April 7 and 8 at the Convention Center were available via prior purchase. <u>Pre-purchased meals may be picked up</u> on the 3rd floor terrace by the school advisor and one or two students to help carry the meals. (Name badges with school on them are required.) They may then meet their students on the second floor terrace or on the first floor of the parking garage.

<u>Concessions available for purchase</u> (payment by credit card only) burgers, hot dogs, salads, nachos, light snacks, and beverages during the following times:

- Monday, April 8: Lobby Concessions 1st floor 8:00a 3:30p Café 2nd floor: 8:00a - 1:15p

Students may eat on the lawn, on the steps to the second floor terrace, and in the parking garage.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

The use of alcohol, tobacco, electronic cigarettes, or other illegal drugs is strictly prohibited. Any student found in possession or under the influence of these substances will be sent home from the conference without delay at the expense of the student, his/her parents or the student's school. Both the student's principal and parents will be notified, and local authorities may be contacted.

CONFERENCE SAFETY

All conference attendees are expected to respect the rights and safety of others. Weapons of any type are strictly prohibited at TASC functions. Any person found in the possession of an item that is used as a weapon or exhibiting irresponsible behavior that endangers the health, safety, or welfare of him/herself or others will be sent home from the conference without delay at the expense of the student, his/her parents or the student's school. Both the student's principal and parents will be notified, and local authorities may be contacted. A student sent home from a TASC event because of disruption of the conference, a violation of TASC policies, or a concern for the safety of that student and/or others will not be allowed to attend another TASC state event for a calendar year.

STATE OFFICER ELECTIONS

One of the purposes of the TASC Annual Conference is to elect new state officers for the upcoming school year. Schools elected to serve as TASC state officers are represented on the TASC Board of Directors by one student representative and the school advisor. The Board of Directors is the policy-making body for the association. Throughout the conference, member schools will have multiple opportunities to learn about the candidate schools' qualifications and platform (an idea they are promoting for TASC). Candidates will communicate their campaign theme, platform, and qualifications through a campaign booth, storyboard, student speech, meet the candidate session, and a campaign skit.

Candidate school information is posted on the TASC website. When voting, schools should consider how well the candidates communicate their platform and theme, the strength of the platform, and the qualifications of the advisor and student representative.

BALLOTING INFORMATION: VOTING THROUGH ELECTION RUNNER

Each council in attendance at the conference has up to five student voting delegates for the officer positions. Each council in attendance at the conference has one advisor vote for the elected advisor to the board. Votes will be cast through Election Runner, an online election platform; an advisor must pick up balloting ID's during registration. Before voting, schools should caucus to discuss how to cast their ballots. The five ballots may be split if the council desires. Voting delegates and advisors may vote from 12:00p - 1:00p on Monday, April 8, 2024.

TASC AT SIX FLAGS



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


