NAME BADGES / WRISTBANDS

Each registered delegate and invited guest will be given an official conference name badge and TASC wristband. To ensure student safety, these items must be worn at all times. The conference wristband is admission to all conference sessions. Those without a TASC wristband and name badge will be required to leave. Additionally, the color of the wristband will determine the rotation to be followed for breakout sessions on Day 2 in the afternoon.

DRESS CODE

The TASC Board of Directors requests that all attendees follow the TASC Conference dress code. No shorts of any type are to be worn to any conference activity with the exception of mid-thigh or longer shorts the night at Six Flags. Hats or caps are not allowed in the building, and all shirts and dresses must have sleeves. Security and advisors will help monitor dress code.

STUDENT DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

Student drop-off is on East Randol Mill Road bus loop directly under the Arlington Loews Convention Center.

PARKING

Parking is available at the Arlington Loews Convention Center for a \$29 charge with come-and-go privileges. Parking is also available at nearby lots for the Texas Rangers. The height limit at the Loews Convention Center is only 8ft 10" which will not accommodate buses. There are a few bus parking spots at a nearby lot. Special arrangements must be made with TASC to access that parking. TASC will issue a parking pass which must be visible on the dash of each vehicle admitted to that large vehicle parking lot. Parking passes at Six Flags are included with your park admission fee.

GENERAL SESSION ENTRY AND SEATING

Doors to the General Session will open approximately 30 minutes to one hour before session start time. Any school group may enter the room and secure seating. Schools may reserve seats for their delegation ONLY. At least one person from the delegation must remain with marked seats at all times. Any item used to mark seats reserved will be removed if there is not at least one person from the delegation present at all times. Please fill the seats in the middle of rows first. Do not leave empty seats. Do NOT run in the Convention Center. The fire marshal prohibits standing at the sides or back of the auditorium. Due to security needs, all advisors must be seated with their students.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

While you are invited to update your social media about conference activities, we ask that advisors and students silence their phones and follow rules of business etiquette in the use of cell phones and tablet computers. Please be a model of consideration and respect for all attending conference sessions.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR

With the convention attendance totaling almost 4,000 delegates, advisors must sit with their students during the general sessions and monitor and control excessive noise. Even a few whispers in the auditorium create a lot of noise. Always treat speakers on stage with courtesy and respect. Advisors: Please ensure that your students remain seated during performances. Walking from the general assembly area to the halls is distracting.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE

No outside food or drinks may be taken into the Arlington Loews Convention Center. There are restaurants and a food stand near the lobby for grab and go drinks and light meals.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

The use of alcohol, tobacco, electronic cigarettes, or other illegal drugs is strictly prohibited. Any student found in possession or under the influence of these substances will be sent home from the conference without delay at the expense of the student, his/her parents or the student's school. Both the student's principal and parents will be notified, and local authorities may be contacted.

CONFERENCE SAFETY

All conference attendees are expected to respect the rights and safety of others. Weapons of any type are strictly prohibited at TASC functions. Any person found in the possession of an item that is used as a weapon or exhibiting irresponsible behavior that endangers the health, safety, or welfare of him/herself or others will be sent home from the conference without delay at the expense of the student, his/her parents or the student's school. Both the student's principal and parents will be notified, and local authorities may be contacted. A student sent home from a TASC event because of disruption of the conference, a violation of TASC policies, or a concern for the safety of that student and/or others will not be allowed to attend another TASC state event for a calendar year.

STATE OFFICER ELECTIONS

One of the purposes of the TASC Annual Conference is to elect new state officers for the upcoming school year. Schools elected to serve as TASC state officers are represented on the TASC Board of Directors by one student representative and the school advisor. The Board of Directors is the policy-making body for the association. Throughout the conference, member schools will have multiple opportunities to learn about the candidate schools' qualifications and platform (an idea they are promoting for TASC). Candidates will communicate their campaign theme, platform, and qualifications through a campaign booth, storyboard, student speech, meet the candidate session, and a campaign skit.

Candidate school information is posted on the TASC website. When voting, schools should consider how well the candidates communicate their platform and theme, the strength of the platform, and the qualifications of the advisor and student representative.

Voting delegates and advisors may vote from 12:00p - 1:00p on Sunday, March 30, 2025.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: HOUSTON KRAFT

If we want schools where students and staff thrive, Kindness must be at the foundation. That said, empathy has dropped 40% in the average college-aged student since the year 2000. 73% of Generation Z says they sometimes or always feel alone. In a world that is divisive, anxious, and disconnected, Kindness is an essential ingredient for a more hopeful future. The bad news? We are bad at it. Drawing from his work in over 10,000 schools globally, Houston will demonstrate why we need to redefine Kindness and the tactical approach that is necessary to educate the next generation toward compassion.

In 2016, Houston Kraft co-founded Character Strong which currently serves 10,000 schools across 50 states and 49 countries helping to support the teaching of character and social-emotional skills in education. In 2019, his face was featured on Lays BBQ chip bags as someone who helps "spread smiles." In 2020, his first book Deep Kindness was published by Simon & Schuster. In 2023, the companion guide Be Kind was published. He has been featured on Good Morning America, CNN, Hallmark, and more as an expert on developing a more empathetic, kind world. His mom is his hero and her best life lesson is to "hug like you mean it."

STUDENT BREAKOUT SESSION ROTATIONS (DAY 2 AFTERNOON)

Conference Breakout Sessions will take place on Day 2 afternoon from 1:30p - 4:00p. Delegates will be divided into three separate groups, and each group will follow a separate rotation through each of the three breakout session stations (below). Rotation schedule will be determined by the color of the delegate wristband. Entire school delegations will be in the same rotation (same color wristbands). Student delegates will choose THREE of the offered presentations to attend during the 40 minute session. All presentations will be repeated in all three time blocks. Presenting students will remain at the same table while student delegates move around to various tables during the time block. This movement will be a structured process guided by a facilitator. 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
