## **Board of Directors Policy Regarding Endorsements and/or Partnerships**

Programs/projects that complement the mission and purpose of student council may be considered by the Board for an endorsement/partnership. Programs or projects interested in forming a partnership with TASC must demonstrate in writing the ways in which the program enhances the work of or provides a resource to student councils. Programs/projects sponsored by member schools are preferred. The Board will approve this type of relationship at the summer board meeting. The board may determine to limit the number of endorsed programs. These relationships benefit TASC member schools directly, either by providing a resource to the council or to individual students. Endorsed programs often exhibit at TASC events and present at TASC events. Benefits to an endorsed program/partner may include access to member schools data for marketing, inclusion in conferences through presentations and reduced exhibit rates, a link on the TASC website, and inclusion in the TASC Resource Guide. Relationships are established by a board vote and are renewed annually. Existing programs must demonstrate participation by and benefit to schools and justify the continuation of the relationship in writing.

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Mission/Purpose of Organization	Teens in the Driver Seat® is the first peer-to-peer program for teens that focuses solely on traffic safety and addresses all major risks for this age group and involves teenagers directly in developing and delivering driving safety messages.  The goal of Teens in the Driver Seat® is to raise awareness of the top driving dangers for teens and prevent crashes involving young drivers. The program empowers teens to spread the word among their peers about deadly driving risks and encourages them to make smart choices while behind the wheel and as passengers.

The Teens in the Driver Seat® (TDS) program is a peer-to-peer driving safety program designed by teens for teens. Just like TASC, TDS encourages students to develop leadership skills by being an ambassador of the program to spread the safe driving message. (See About** Us tab at www.tasconline.org.) Upon starting the program, the students are placed in the leadership position to design and structure the program to suit their own community. Students are encouraged to work in groups, to effectively customize and conduct the program. To participate in the Teens in the Driver Seat® program TASC members schools should use this process: Step 1: Identify team members and order a Resource Tool Kit Once a team has been identified and established, the team will fill out and submit an order form for their free Resource Tool Kit. The items in the toolkit are used to remind students about safe driving. Step 2: Find out what people know • It is recommended that schools administer program surveys to their students. This will help to assess the students' levels of driving risk awareness as well as their driving behavior. A report of the survey findings will be sent to the school after completion. Step 3: Spread the Message Describe in detail the process for TASC member school Once the students have completed the surveys, the team is participation in this program. ready to start informing and changing the students' attitudes about driving safety. The program is flexible and can be customized according to the team's determination of how to spread messages most effectively. Thus, teams are allowed to undertake whatever activities they believe will resonate best with their peers. Step 4: Keep the program going • We encourage program schools to plan activities throughout the entire school year. Participate in the All-Star Awards program by submitting activities and events conducted at their school or in their community, so that the students are reminded of the TDS safety message. Lastly, it is important that at the end of the school year, students recruit new team leaders to plan for and continue the program for the next school year. What is the benefit of this The Teens in the Driver Seat® program has been instrumental in partnership to the TASC reducing the number of teen-driver crashes in Texas. 	Through this partnership, TASC is closely affiliated with a growing program by educating teens, their peers, and the community on the risks and dangers associated with car crashes, which are one of the leading causes of injury and death for this age group. Teens help shape the program and are responsible for implementing it and educating their peers and parents; Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI) provides the science, guidance, and project resources.
	The program also helps develop leadership skills among students and facilitates opportunities for them to serve on the statewide Teens in the Drive Seat® Teen Advisory Board (TAB). This TAB involvement has helped many students enhance their leadership skills, get community service credit(s) and bolster their resumes as they work toward goals beyond high school.

Partnering with TASC has allowed the Teens in the Driver Seat® program to, effectively and efficiently, reach young drivers, passengers, and vulnerable road users, helping to promote a healthier driving safety culture and helping to ensure that capable young leaders are at the forefront of that mission.
