On March 7, 2019, over 315 students, faculty and staff from Legacy High School and Mansfield High School went into the Mansfield community for a single day of community service. Students served over 14 different locations throughout the city. The day culminated with a picnic lunch at a local park.

Legacy High School Advisor, Kenna Cavnar, first discussed the idea with then Student Body President Mady Walker who agreed that the project would allow students an active role in giving back to the community and promote cooperation within the district. They reached out to Student Council Sponsor Ryan Golden at Mansfield High School who agreed to join in the venture. After months of organizing and planning, both schools came together for this one event. The project was established with the plan of adding more MISD schools every year until every campus was a part of the event. What sprung from a single idea blossomed into a multi-campus yearly event to provide community services to the city and local charities. MISD Day of Service 2020 is scheduled for March 5 and has added three additional schools, Lake Ridge High School, Wester Middle School, and Jobe Middle School.

The City of Mansfield helped coordinate the locations and provided a hot dog lunch for all participants. Students worked picking up trash in local parks, helping at the animal shelter, loaded groceries at the local food pantry, painted rocks, cleaned the community gardens, washed park equipment and played games with the Senior Citizens group at the local activities center.

On April 22, 2019, Mansfield High School and Legacy High School were awarded the 2019 MVP Project form the City of Mansfield. They were recognized and honored by the MISD School Board on April 24, 2019.

I had the pleasure of participating in Legacy's Day of Service during the 2018-19 school year. It was a fantastic day of watching over 300 of our MISD high school students reach out to help our community. This event brought students from a variety of clubs out to work in our city parks, local pet shelters, food bank, and MAC activities center. Students who participated performed a variety of different services which include: cleaning up the park, washing pets, playing cards with our elderly citizens and cleaning buildings that needed a little sprucing up.

This was a great way for our students to see that it takes the community to take care of the community. Students learned to work together in an effort to help out our city organizations. I really enjoyed seeing our students working cooperatively with peers from other local high schools in our district. We ended the day with lunch and reflection on how our efforts affect and help the community.
